Dear Doctor: -

It was entirely an oversight that the American Medico-Psychological Society was omitted from the Committee. Bowditch and Keen and I talked the matter over, and we agreed that it would be best to make the members of the Committee the Surgeons-General, the President of the American Medical Association, the President of the Congress of American Physicians and Surgeons, and the Presidents of the Societies constituting the Congress. This we thought would give a very fair representation of the profession. Then at the meeting I brought the matter up again, and our action was confirmed. One addition was suggested, as there was a section of dentistry, that the President of the American Dental Association should be asked also. We shall have another meeting in May, and I shall very gladly bring up the question again.
