Dear Professor Shcafer,

I have to thank you for the definite information that Professor Osler is a candidate for the Chair.

I am glad that this is the case, for I did not think it practically possible that the Curators should invite him to the Chair of their own motive.

What I have heard of Professor Osler since his name was mentioned leaves me in no doubt as to his reputation. It is right that I should not finally pronounce my adhesion to his cause until I have read and considered what is to be advanced in support of others. But, as you are probably aware, it is absolutely certain that I shall vote for the man whom I believe to be the most highly qualified, irrespective of all personal or local connections.
