It strikes me as peculiar that Mr. Gates and John D. did not ask Osler, in view of the Gates letters to W.O. regarding the relation of the Text-book to the Institute. Perhaps they did. I didn't mean to imply that he would have been a desirable addition, I merely mean that he would have been a natural choice; but please answer my specific question as you can. You were at the meeting, and with Barker and Novy gave an account of your San Francisco plague observations.
