I am not a surgeon, but I should think in a case like yours it would be important to have skilled surgical advice. The probability is that you only require rest and time. You probably could do your work if you had the knee properly put up and went about on crutches for a time. If you care to come here you could be treated in the hospital. I have no doubt that Dr. Hurd, the Director of the Hospital, would be glad to give you a bed in one of the small rooms at the back of the ward at seven dollars a week. You would be perfectly comfortable there, and I know Prof. Halsted or Prof. Finney would be very glad indeed to do anything for you. Could you not sail for Barbadoes from this port?
