What a remarkable condition! I remember the stomach very well in the case Flexner describes. I suppose it means it gives him a very fair chance of recovery. Do report the case. They are very unusual. It is quite possible that syphilis of the stomach is more common than we suppose. Einhorn was to have read a paper upon it at Saratoga last week. Syphilis of the liver I am sure we often overlook. We have had some very instructive cases this winter.

I shall see you in Montreal about July 1st. I think we shall like it at Murray Bay; I am sure Mrs. Osler will. We have taken a house, and I doubt if I shall be much bothered with patients. It will give me a good fourteen weeks rest before the Canadian Medical Association. I hope to get away early next year.
