Dear Sir:-

Dr. Brebner, Registrar of the University of Toronto, has sent on to me your inquiry in regard to the date of the late Sir William Osler's D.C.L. It was conferred on the occasion of the celebration of the Jubilee of the opening of this College in June, 1902. At the same time the same degree was conferred upon Mr. E. Douglas Armour, K.C., the Revd. Professor J.P. Whitney, then principal of Bishop's College, Lennoxville, but now a professor of Church History in the University of Cambridge, together with the Honorable Richard Harcourt, Minister of Education for this province, the late Sir James Whitney, then leader of the opposition in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario and later Premier of the province, and several other men, clerics and others.

You will probably find in the Harvard library a copy of the Trinity College Year Book for 1902-03. In that is given a list of the other recipients of degrees on that occasion together with some account of the ceremonies connected with the celebration of the Jubilee. The Chancellor of that day was Mr. Christopher Robinson, K.C., D.C.L., a barrister who very often argued cases before the Imperial Privy Council and who took part in at least one international case.

Presently I shall send you a copy of our War Memorial Volume, the first name in which you will find to be that of Sir William Osler.
