I brought over some things for you this morning and find your letter. I do not think it is worth while sending you any more letters, as they have nothing that you are not likely to have, but these I am sending may be useful because although you may have the same material, the additional range may have some value. J.Wm. White, Jr. is the full name of the J.W.W. jr. signed to the article on Peyronie's Disease published in the Medical News, Philadelphia, about 1902. You must have it, but have forgotten the initials. If you haven't it, let me know and I will send you my copy, which I have not with me at present. The thing is additionally interesting because the data are wrong in some respects. I never had a chance to ask W.O. how it happened, but imagine it was part of the mystification. The chief things are that he speaks of Pyronie as a French surgeon, although, as you know, he could have had a great deal more said about him. Also he attributes the word "squint" to Pyronie, though he must have known that it was Ricord who applied that pictureque term.

There is no hurry about returning the material.
