I hope Erlanger has sent you his study of the experimental production of Heart-Block and his careful account of two of my cases. One of these patients, the younger of the two, has completely recovered. He had had syphilis and I think, in all probability, the condition was a luetic ~~arteritis~~ ^{arteritis} or a local gumma. He has remained well now for nine months, pulse above 80, and ^{he} has had no syncopal attacks.
