I am awfully disappointed, as I had hoped to meet all my friends in Toronto.

I did not tell you that I examined Mrs. Worthington's girl a couple of months ago and found her very much better. She has a large mitral leak, but perfect compensation and a not excessive grade of hypertrophy. Barring the accident of a recurrent rheumatism, and if she takes ordinary care, the lesion is one which even may promote longevity, though I am afraid it scarcely comes within this happy class.
