Dear Mr. Gates:

You have, of course, noticed the hard whacks which my old alma mater, McGill, has had in these two big fires. No doubt Sir William Macdonald, who built the Engineering Department, will restore it, but I am afraid from what I hear that the Medical faculty has been very hard hit by the loss of their fine buildings. Do you think it would be possible to interest Mr. Rockefeller to the extent of a couple of hundred thousand dollars? It would mean everything to them and would really encourage a group of men who have been doing splendid work for the community.

I shall be in the country for a couple of weeks. I shall be in Montreal on Tuesday and Wednesday, at Dr. Shepherd's, 135 Mansfield Street. After that my address will be Johns Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore.
