CORRESPONDENCE with Dr. Knopf relating to the outrageous slander in the Philadelphia North American for Wednesday, May 8, 1907, in which he was accused of recommending that consumptives be killed off with morphine, and that he himself followed this practice. The newspapers took this up with the most outrageous vigor, and made copy of it everywhere. Knopf sued the North American, he having sent a telegram to them asking them to correct the statement, which they ignored.
