Revere gave us a fright last week with an attack of pneumonia, which started rather furiously, but he behaved like a gentleman, and had his crisis on the 6th day, and he is now very comfortable. The school sanatorium is first class, and he had a couple of good nurses.

While in Winchester I saw a case with a Dr. Boddington, who turned out to be a grandson of George B., and I wheedled out of him the old man's original account of his tuberculosis treatment. I have been after it for years.
