Dear Mac:-

On the receipt of your cable I wired at once "Do not publish uncorrected index", but I am afraid both your cable and mine were too late, as I have a letter from the London office today saying that they are issuing the new edition in America on Friday 26th. I cabled them on the 10th to await the revised proofs of contents, but they write from the London office "at that time the book was actually on the press and it was therefore too late to do anything". I hope that you had already spotted some of the errors in the Table of Contents. It will be very aggravating if the index comes out full of errors, as this part of the book has heretofore been singularly free from them, and if there is one thing more annoying than another it is to have mistakes in the index. I hope my pages of special points in the index got there in time.

Well! you will be glad to have seen the last of it. I will send you in a few days a draft of the contract we should have about the book.
