The <u>Historical Number</u>, Johns Hopkins Hospital Reports, Vol. I, No. 1, was published Oct. 9th, 1912. A dinner was given to Nuttall on that date when he gave the Lectures on the Herter Foundation. There are sketches by Max Brödel:-

"The entrance of George H. F. Nuttall to the family circle" i.e.

Nuttall and Flexner falling down the stairs leading into the hall of
a house where W.O., Abbott, Thayer, Welch, Halsted & Hurd are sitting
before a grate fire. Then there is a sketch of the "Welch and Nuttall
Gas Plant" - a cherub lighting the capsulated bacillus which is growing
in great profusion on a tree - other non-capsulated bacilli grow there
also. Then the photograph, "What the Family looked like in 1892" on the steps of the hospital, is reproduced. Another is "The Pilgrimage, March 25, 1893" - "TO EUROPE" on a sign and three gents carrying their satchels - Cullen, Nuttall and Flexner (whose nose shows en

profile). The last page has merely "Tick-Tick" - "the Arbeit that
made Nuttall Famous." On the back of the green cover is painted:
"Halsted & Welch, printers, Wolfe & Monument Sts., Baltimore, Md."
