I wish I could take Kiplings 'Night Mail' and spend a couple of peaceful weeks at Avalon We have had such a strenuous life lately - so much to do & so many people coming & going, chiefly coming! The Hadleys have been with us for a fortnight such charming people. She talked much of Lois & the baby. Mrs. McCagg of Chicago. another old friend of Lois' is with us. Hadleys lectures on Democracy & Property have been very popular. We are begining to see daylight in the Ulster darkness. Exclusion seems the only solution. It will take several generations of prosperity to make a United Ireland. Revere took all his etchings & sketches away so that I have not been able to send you an example. He is such a satisfactory lad & we are great chums. How is 'Uncle "ed' of whom - have not heard for months. Give him my love. We did enjoy seeing him so much. Please do not neglect Sylvia for that baby. I can well imagine her delight at a real live doll in the house / Grace joins me in love & congratulations Tnank R.B. for his nice letters
