Dear Henry V.,

We are having a very busy time over here, as you may suppose, but the country is in fine form, and will pull through all right. Grace and Revere sailed for Canada the end of July, but returned by the same steamer. She has been working like a Trojan ever since. Revere is at Christ Church and in the Officers' Training Corps, and will apply for a commission as soon as fit.

I am sending you a bundle of our Oxford literature, which may interest you, including the Red Book, which has Grey's speech.

A great deal has been done by America. We are specially interested in the poor Belgian professors, of whom we have fifteen in Oxford - the majority penniless. We are settling them in houses, clothing their families, and, fortunately, the Rockefeller Foundation has offered to subsidize the science men.

Of course, I could not come to Baltimore - much to my regret.
