Dear J. William,

Your last contribution has, I think, been acknowledged. Out of the total 10,000 dollars, the result of Lady Osler's appeal, you are responsible for just over 3,000. Splendid for Philadelphia! We have not yet had a list of the Philadelphia subscribers. Lady Osler or I would like to write to them personally.

It is not an easy matter to get anything specific to do, apart from the Red Cross or the Army Medical. Keogh tells me they have had to sit severely upon all outside independent hospitals and units for the front, as they found it was not possible to control their work. The English provisions for the front and at the base hospitals seem excellent, but the French need help. The best work is being done apparently through the American Hospital in Paris.

Should I hear of anything specific, I will let you know, or even cable you.
