Dear Armstrong:

I have urged Keogh, the Director-General, to take your Unit as soon as possible. There are difficulties, as the question of holding the coast is still doubtful.

I have been looking over the photographs of atrocities and of mutilations and have asked in the various hospitals, and one can never get anything closer than this dammed third person whom I should like to mutilate personally. I suppose there have been atrocities, particularly in the sack of Louvain, but in other parts I think they have been grossly exaggerated. Love to all.
