

From Dr. Malloch's Journal.
Wednesday, Dec. 25, 1914.

Drove out to Ewelme 14 miles to church. Very cold and fine needles in air ... Farms bring in £5,000 a year, and Sir Wm. as Regius Professor and Master gets a little of it . . . Sir Wm. at and after supper said since Revere had shown such a taste for books he had changed his will. Will have perpetual row with Revere about who is to get certain books. Sir Wm. intends to make a catalogue - more about each book than Bywater's (who died this week) - of Bibliotheca Osleriana McGillensis (X) - giving outline and telling student where to get best biography of the man. Will do Bibliotheca Prima first (chief men who have meant so much to science and medicine), the Secunda - Literaria (Weir Mitches etc.) then medical Incunabula.

Breakfast day - first of January - eaten boys & was chests - a public house which used to be called Wm of Prussia & changed to King George Arms.

Bywater was the great scholar at Ch. Ch. Murray, Fredericson - the collector in Bodley.
