So glad to hear that O'Conner thinks your eyes are better.

We had a busy Christmas - two or three of the fellows form the Contingent on Salisbury Plain, where they are in a sea of mud. The weather has been most unfortunate. We have never had so much rain. The whole country is soaked. Things are looking brighter here, and it is a great matter that at the beginning of the sixth month Germany has not even finished with Belgium. But is is a devil of a mess: Revere has been in the Training Corps here, and is now joining the Universities and Fublic Schools Regiment.
