While people are disturbed here at the attitude of the Administration and one hears criticisms of Wilson, on the other hand, all one meets who have personal friends in America are delighted with the strong sympathy expressed with the Allies. I do not think there is anything to worry about in the matter.

Your letter to Owen Seaman is first-rate, and the draft of a portion of a chapter from, I suppose, the new edition. I have not yet seen the foreign translations of your book. They will, of course, be sent to you at once.

Do you think enough has been made in America of the great work France did in the days of the Revolutionary War? Have you ever seen the volume issued a few years ago in Washington - "Les Combatants francais de la Guerre Américaine", Washington, 1905?
