Cushing has been here for a couple of days and was very enterminated thusiastic about the American Hospital at Paris. He got up to the front and gives a sad story about these cases of gas bronchiolitis, of which we are beginning to get some cases.

This "Lusitania" horror has shocked everyone. It makes it very sad for those of us with old and valued associations in Germany to think that her good name should be so dragged in the dust by these cursed militarists. It will take generations to bridge the present gulf.
