Dear Dock:

I have no negative of St. Martin. You mean, I suppose the photograph given me by Judge Bauby, which Gray had copied and enlarged at the Army Medical Museum. I daresay he may have the negative.

I am sure you must have had a delightful celebration. Do not forget to send me the reports. It is really very satisfactory that you have got all the documents relating to Beaumont.

Things go on here much the same as usual. If it were not for the men in khaki and the daily death roll, one would scarcely realize that war was in progress. We are very busy; all sorts of things on hand, and there is an extraordinary amount of interest at the hospitals. Revere went off yesterday with the McGill unit, which is going somewhere south of Calais. He has been for three months at the big hospital at Cleveden, and has got a good deal of useful information about the commisseriat and business side of things.
