(Letter to Dr. Cushing
from Dr. Cheever.)

Dec. 7, 1915.

The day after our arrival Perry and I went down to Oxford on invitation to lunch with Sir William and had a most pleasant time. He at once invited our whole Unit to Oxford and we went thirty strong last Friday and were royally entertained. Sir William, who was in khaki, showed us first the big hospital of 500 beds which has been established in the University Halls and then showed us over the University itself. We had luncheon in Christchurch Hall with the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Strong, and some thirty of the local dignitaries and Medical Officers. Then more sight-seeing and tea with Lady Osler.

I thus particularise about our trip because it gives such good evidence of the way Sir William would have liked to treat the first Harvard Unit.
