Dear Miss Lering

I saw the dear patient this afternoon & sent you a cable on my return. She[is] in most comfortable quarters and could not be better cared for. The nurse is excellent & Miss Parsons likes her very much. She has also the little girl who is devoted to her by day. She is much weaker, but suffers no pain, only the inconvenience of the somewhat frequent vomiting. She has good nights with a moderate dose of Morphia. Altogether I am glad she did not move to the Acland Home here, as she is among her friends, many of whom come in I told the nurse to spare no trouble or expense. She sends me word every few days. The end cannot be far off, but she has wonderful vitality "Grace sends Towe. Our boy went over past week to join his battery & take his place with the fine fellows who are fighting the cause of freedom
