For I had the volume in my hand the day before the sale & left a bid, but the man from N. Y. was too much. And now to think that it should have come back: & in this delightful way. 'Twill be the chiefest of my Browne treasures. And so well coffined. I am in luck! Only a few weeks ago there came in from Holland no 3 of the 1644 Latin edition, about the existence of which I began to feel doubtful.

I now lack only the 1683 Dutch complete ed. /

Am in bed with a heavy cold - much better. Revere well - on the Ancre pounding away night & day with a battery. He is with such nice men & has enough to do to keep him from worry. You would not know the boy - so developed mentally, & with such a keen eye for books & good literature./

I hope you will have a booklet I sent for Xmas
