That is a fine record! The papers came this morning & I have read them with the keenest interest. I am afraid one element you have not laid proper stress upon - your own personality. Confidence, faith counts for so much with these cases. The personal supervision & care is all important, and not taking too many cases. I will speak of your results at the annual meeting of our County association next week. Gout papers of course interest me - the incidence of the disease depends on the eyes of the doctor in charge of the hospital. I was told by a well known Scotch physician - Oh, Gout has disappeared from Scotland !" I found tophi in two cases of his chronic rheumatic cases. The multiple gouty febrile arthritis is not uncommon here. I have seen two cases, both with tophi, in soldiers. All well. Revere we hope back in rest billets. His battery has been in action continuously since Oct. 1st. / Love to Rosamund & the children.
