sent to W. O. from Dr. Adami

May 16th, 1917.

My dear Sir William,

Probably you tried to get me by telephone last night, but our system is so over worked that it is quite likely you gave up in despair. I kicked myself afterwards for not offering, as I ought, to telephone to you at that hour. Happily there was no immediate hurry: I do, however, thank you very sincerely for so promptly once more shewing the quality of your friendship, and your willingness to help in need.

Herewith I forward to you a copy of the missing venereal report. I think I pointed out to you that I cannot give you officially the total number of the C. E. F. which has left Canada. I believe, though, that this number, has been published by Sir Robert Borden, it is somewhere in the neighborhood of 300,000, although as you know it has been steadily increasing from some 33,000 odd in November 1914.
