The men took London by storm. Do let us know if any of your friends come over. We are having a stream of American visitors - so many over on special duties. How I wish I could have a peaceful visit with you all at Avalon! it seems ages since I saw you & I just hate not to see the children as they grow up. Love to uncle Ned. Every one speaks of his splendid war articles. I have not seen Sylvia for months. I must find her address from the Armours. /I tried to send a recent photograph of Revere but they do not allow pictures by post I will get a chance by some friend. Love to the darlings & to R.B.
