My dear Harvey

Your letter from No. 5 came this morning to Grace. We are thankful of your answer that none of our special friends were injured. We have been troubled & could get no direct information. Our thoughts are constantly with you & you would be glad if you could know the comfort that these dear people have all the time in knowing what you did for their boy - I wrote you a scrappy note trying to express it & again I feel inadequate - G. & W. O. are very wonderful - They talk of Revere constantly - & in this place often reminisce of you & of him together. Sir William seems to be shrinking away - but I believe he will pull up soon - & dear Grace looks so sad - At the sea when the horizon is so clear - I love the thought that "death is but an horizon & an horizon but the limit of our vision" - If our Faith only holds strong till the vision comes!

Much love to you - Do spare yourself when you can!

I don't see how I can go home with all our people in France. I think I may try for "a job" there if I am not too old to help.
