So good of you to write. Poor Mall! What a sad loss - a good type of professor & he did a great work for the school. I did not know Janeway well, but I had a sincere regard for his father. Bevan & Mitchell were good friends. Dear me! What losses. Only I wish we old men who are fit and seasoned could go, instead of these nice bright boys. I hope if your laddies come over you will tell them to let us know their addresses at once that we may write or do anything we can to make them comfortable. This house is a distributing depot & parcels leave every day for France. It is wonderful how much our friends have sent us. I am working hard - all sorts of things & so many people coming & going - but always with a sad heart.
