With reference to your enquiry regarding Maude Abbott, for the last three years I have been endeavouring whenever opportunity offered to interest the authorities over here in Maude Abbott and her work, trying to get her over direct through this Service, indirectly through the College of Surgeons, and lastly trying to interest Fotheringham to employ her in Canada, but I have had no luck. They still fight against having female members of the C.A.M.C., and Keith cannot take her at the College of Surgeons on account of having no assistant staff there to help her, being in fact terribly reduced in his staff.

Frankly, I do not see what is to be done, or how to get her over, since Fotheringham evidently has been advised not to employ her services.
