From Dr. Malloch's Journal. Tuesday, Sept. 3, 1918

We went to Radcliffe library and looked about history of anaesthetics. At lunch W.O. told us how Dr. Buller had asked him if he could not invest about the 1st 500 or 600 dollars that he had saved - into a wild-cat scheme. W.O. knows so many who failed. Told us that Dr. James Hamilton (Dundas and Ancaster) after 60 years' practice, invested money in a scheme of his son-in-law's and lost it all. Sir Wm told us of autopsy on case of Hodgkins' disease one Aug. He took train from Montreal to Morrisburg, met Dr. Shearman and others, 8 in all, drove at night, very cold after a hot day. Body buried when they arrived. Dr S. fixed it up; they first refused even when he said that "Prof. Osler" had come all that way. W.O. asked how he did it; he replied "I told him I should foreclose his mortgage on his farm, and he consented at once." Sir Wm. worked a little at the new ed. of the text-book.
