EDWARD REVERE OSLER FUND.

I. In accordance with his interests we devote this fund to the encouragement of the study of English literature in the Tudor and Stuart periods.

II. With this object in view we suggest that the Professors of English literature and the Collegiate Professor of English, their staffs, with the special students of the departments, collegiate and graduate, form a Tudor and Stuart literary club, of which the University Librarian should be an ex officio member.

III. The books collected by Edward Revere Osler to form the nucleus of the Club Library, which should be a section of the departmental library. To these will be added later the special works in English literature collected by me.

IV. The interest of the fund to be expended in the purchase of books relating to the periods, and in the promotion of good fellowship and a love of literature among the members.

V. The management of the Club and the expenditure of the fund to be, as far as possible in the hands of the students; the qualifications for membership to be determined by you, the Professors of English, Prof. Welch and the Librarian; a few special members could be chosen annually.
