Jan. 1, Wed. - Ap. 5, Sat. No notes - very few const.

Ap. 6, Sun. - 9. London B.M.A. mtg.

Ap. 19 \*

\* Began in Inf. At root of eye tooth - swollen face with ? a curious follicular stomatitis. C. fever - looks like a Vincent angina, but it was streptococcus.

Ap. 23, Wed. - 24. \*

\* Had tooth out. Very awkward as I had asked all the Profs of Med. in the Schools of Great Brit. and Ireland to meet Dr Graham (the new Prof. of Med., whole-time at Toronto) at dinner at the Athenaeum Club. Sir H. Rolleston looked after them. Better next day.

Ap. 25, Fr. - July 10, Th. Nonotes. Very few const.

July 11, Fr. \*

\* On Monday, 30th, at the College Club dinner I sat in a thro draught and felt chilled, and all week felt as if a cold had come on. Tues. (8 and 9) I felt seedy and stayed in bed. Friday I went to town to the Assoc. of Br. Phy. and to the presentation of the volumes on the occasion of my 70th birthday. At the meeting in the afternoon I began to cough and decided to come home. By 8 I had a high fever and felt a bit chilly. That night coughed almost incessantly. Sat. Sun. and Mon. I had fever off and on. Much cough of a particularly irritating character like those attacks of bronchial pneumonia. There was no rustiness of the sputum which was scanty and very tenacious. No local signs, no pain. Nothing seemed to check the cough. I got up on the 17th and felt very shaky for a week or more.

Aug. 31, Sun. - Sep. 11. S. Brelade's Bay, Jersey.

Sep. 16, Tu. - Sat. 20. Occasional const. \*

\* Left here night of Sep. 22 to see Mrs. Fulton Martin (Dr. Barclay Ness' patient) of Glasgow. Saw her 23rd with Drs. Ness, Agnes Cameron and Armstrong. Case of erythematous eruptions of skin, with localised subcutaneous swellings in the limbs (six months' duration). Went on to Edinburgh. Stayed with Lovell Gulland, saw Harvey Littlejohn and others. Left Edinburgh 10 p.m. railroad strike at 12, and train stopped at Newcastle. I got a motor and came through arriving Oxford 2.30 Sunday (28th). Caught cold on the way. Laid up 29th and

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30th. Cold in head and then hoarseness and a little cough.

Sep. Mon. 29<sup>x</sup> - 30.<sup>x</sup> & Oct. 1.<sup>x</sup>

\* In bed with cold. Wed.-Fri. I got up each day and went out. <sup>(on terrace)</sup> I was hoarse but did not feel badly until Sat. the 4th when I began to cough and felt feverish - a short, hard cough without expectoration.
