Dear

I saw in the Times of Col. Burnham's death. Poor man - it is too bad!

I enclose you the lecture which I had overlooked. Have been away a good deal in the past week. We had a remarkable case on Sunday of pneumonia admitted with symptoms of tetanus bilateral rigidity, and a dry spinal puncture. The pneumonia signs were marked, and the question was whether the whole business was not meningitis, pneumonic or cerebro-spinal. Pm: pneumonia left lung, acute spinal meningitis and most extensive haemorrhages into the spinal theca, and along exit of nerve roots, with which, no doubt, the spasm was associated.
