I have a card from Paris today which informs us that the French post is not prepared to accept packages of the weight imposed by the medical tablet. In view of the fact that Scheil's brother now at Mosoul has incurred some expense for the tablet I believe I would give him 50 francs on that score. Scheil is a poor man and although he has offered it to us as a gift I knew he would be grateful for the original expenses in the Orient.
