(Ac. K (kbs) So glad you are at home at last & getting settled. What a comfort it will be to have everything in order. Love to the Sarah girl and the others..... We have been here for a month - wonderful spot - such sun and sand and sea. Following the presentation by Allbutt on the 12th of the Anniversary Volumes, I had a sharp attack of pneumonic bronchitis - in bed ten days & I was quite knocked out. I have picked up here rapidly & now feel in good form. Is it true Jacobi has gone? I have had no journals; but Major Mallock who came to us yesterday, said he saw it in the Times. I had a letter from him, just before my birthday. What a fine ~~evening~~ ^{innings} he had!... Murray will send you on my Classical Association address. - Not an easy job to follow Asquith, Balfour, Morley & who have held the chair in alternate years, when a non-classic is elected. Send me Sarton's address. He said he might be coming thro. England. I may have missed him. He will probably go back to America..... I am deep in the revision of my text book - long overdue! It is hard work. I wish you could see my catalogue booming, but 'tis a long job and I get very little time. We have had a constant stream of visitors & so much to do outside. This is the first good rest we have had since the war. I am hearing constantly from Wenckebach, as we have tried to stock some of the Viennese Hospitals. Conditions have been awful. - but it is the same everywhere. and the losses! Of our College club-dinners of twenty members 15 have lost sons, two have lost two - and poor Garrod all three!.....
