Prochaines séances à huis-clos sur le prix des autos canadiens.

On correspond de la PRESSE Ottawa, 10. L'hon. George-H. Sedgewick, président de la commission du tarif, a déclaré à l'enquête sur l'industrie de l'automobile que les prix des autos canadiennes ne pouvaient être tenues, cette semaine, en rapport avec des renseignements confidentiels. Plus tard, cela pourra se faire. Le président de la "Ford Motor", a fait observer que sa compagnie s'occupait de la fabrication d'automobiles aux avancées gouvernements. Le "Canadian Automobile Chamber of Commerce" a déclaré que les cinq compagnies qui comprennent cette association veulent bien laisser les avocats des provinces faire leur travail dans les tribunaux des véhicules de la commission.

Un pas dans la bonne voie "Je félicite M. Long d'avoir fait un pas dans la bonne voie", fait observer Me C-H. O'Halloran, avocat du gouvernement de la Colombie-Britannique, mais je ne crois pas qu'il y ait un grand espoir de voir le tarif des autos canadiennes abaissé. Il comprend qu'aucune compagnie ne veut laisser les détails de son coût de revient aux mains de ses concurrents. Il suggère qu'on puisse s'occuper de la question. —S.M. O'Halloran continue, dit le président Sedgewick, il obtiendra probablement tout ce qu'il veut.

Les autos pour l'exportation M. H. Rowell, de la compagnie Ford, dit que les fabricants d'auto achètent des parties d'auto d'exportation à un prix moindre que celui de vente au Canada. Cela vient de ce que, à cause des règlements imposés, il est nécessaire d'avoir pour un auto expédié en Australie, par exemple, des pièces de rechange pour l'auto vendue au Canada. Afin de maintenir à bas prix l'auto exportée et y mettre le contenu canadien en plus, on devrait y entrer que lorsqu'il s'agit de fabriquer un auto qui reste au Canada.

Le président avoue que l'industrie automobile canadienne est en danger de disparition. A moins il s'agit de savoir jusqu'à quel point le consommateur canadien doit payer pour continuer ce commerce d'exportation. D'après les témoignages entendus jusqu'ici, les efforts des fabricants pour réduire davantage le prix de vente de leurs produits ont été contrariés par les impôts.

Les fabricants de parties d'auto-mobilité ont déclaré à la commission que les droits imposés sur les pièces de rechange pour l'auto-mobilité ont entraîné un travail considérable, dans les provinces, pour les fabricants. Comme on le sait, il faut que le contenu canadien soit de 50 pour cent, y compris matériaux et main-d'œuvre. Les fabricants de parties d'auto-mobilité ont suggéré qu'on leur remette sans leurs importations et à leur tour de la protection pour leur industrie. Le "General Motors" a déclaré qu'il n'est pas d'accord avec ce point de vue et que, généralement, chez les autres fabricants, les pièces de rechange pour l'auto-mobilité sont plus chères que les pièces de rechange pour l'auto-mobilité.

Repondant à une question du commissaire Hébert, M. A.-E. McGinnis a déclaré que les deux de leurs directeurs sont Canadiens. M. W.-J. Smith, contrôleur de la même compagnie, dit que la politique de la compagnie est de vendre l'auto-mobilité pour ce qu'elle est, un véhicule de transport, sur le fret, la "General Motors" ne fait aucun profit.

"C'est du bluffing?" —C'est la même chose, fait observer le président Sedgewick. Si le projet est accordé à un vendeur d'une auto-mobilité, il y a un pas de plus de l'autre. M. Sedgewick ne voit pas de raison pour qu'un vendeur fasse du profit sur le fret. "C'est dit", "hum", dit-il, "je doute-là". Tout ceci me paraît étrange.

M. R.-P. Sparks, représentant l'Association des Vendeurs d'Automobiles, n'accepte pas cette déclaration concernant les profits que l'on accorde au vendeur d'une auto-mobilité. M. Smith dit que c'est une chose dure depuis cinq ans.

Les changements de modèles M. O'Halloran demande si le coût de production du modèle d'automobiles a changé ou si le modèle d'automobiles a changé sans l'année. M. Smith répond dans l'affirmative, mais il n'est pas sûr de l'exactitude de ce qu'il a dit. M. Smith dit que c'est une chose dure depuis cinq ans.

Fifty-four years ago the Windsor Hotel was opened with great éclat and, of course, the "Hall" went into bankruptcy.

And yet the Windsor with all its splendor never rivalled the "Hall" in one important particular. Take, for example, Henri Jonas and his chums, who assembled at a table of their own FOR YEARS at the OLD STAND. Their jollity and real friendship for one another never, in my observation, had any parallel in Dominion Square.

All the faces in that little CLUB live in my memory, but of names I can recall only Rosenheim, partner of Jonas; Sauvalle, a Cuban; and Schwob, a jeweller.

A Gentile of German descent was about the pleasantest of the bunch, plus a French Canadian newspaper man who sang like a bird!

- - - - -

Hogan, two or three years after the "Hall" closed in bankruptcy, resumed his old place as landlord. Much to the mortification of the Windsor folks, he stole away a goodly percentage of their business. His house faced the Post Office and was half a block from the Bank of Montreal. 1786 ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF 1936
 MOLSON'S BREWERY

THE underground vaults which John Molson built in 1786 are still a part of the Molson's Brewery. To step into them, is to step into the eighteenth century. A magnificent example of the stonework of their time, they are referred to in The Founder's letters of 1787 and 1788, as follows: "Have built a malting in addition to the old one (which is converted into brewhouse and cellar) I bought previous to my coming to England—80 feet long, 39 feet wide, of stone. 'Tis finished and I have begun to malt this three weeks . . . Have almost paid my carpenters and masons bills — 600 bushels barley hops for season, wood for winter fuel and £100 cash in hand."

The brewery site itself has long since lost its early characteristics. Massive modern buildings replace the initial structures. The garden lots fronting



the river and the shipyard from which the "Accommodation", Canada's first steamboat, was launched, have long since disappeared. Gone is the path along which oxen plodded, towing vessels past the St. Mary's Current. The growing brewery overtook them all.

The landmarks have gone, but the character and purpose which underwrote The Founder's success, maintain. Like the underground vaults, they have held through five generations.
