London, Jan 28<sup>th</sup> 1839

Gents,

I was much disappointed this morning on opening your letter of the 23<sup>rd</sup> of December to find that it did not contain a remittance. I take the liberty to enclose a statement of your Account, made out up to the end of last month, and shall feel obliged by your favouring me, by return of the first ship, either with cash, or a short bill, payable in London, for the entire amount. And in future, as you keep the books at a very reduced price, I would much rather that the Account should be settled at the end of each half year. If you have not already disposed of the 530 copies of Rogers's Poems, perhaps you would be kind enough to make me an offer for them, as I am desirous that the matter should not now any longer stand over. The Sonnets being of little value, and, I fear, unsaleable, no further notice need be taken of them.
