Dear Sir

I thank you for your letter; you will be glad to hear, if you have not already heard, that the promoters of the water company have withdrawn their scheme for the Clarendon well, & that the gentlemen who are conducting the opposition on the part of the Wandle owners & occupiers will bind them to terms which

prevent their sinking any well in
dangerous proximity to the Wandle
Springs. This is especially good
news to me, since even if I
were not peculiarly interested
in the flow of the water, I
should, both as an artist & a
man of letters, feel myself sorely
injured by the destruction of
the beauty of this famous little
Stream. Indeed I feel much
stronger about the matter than
you might think from my letter,
since I thought it prudent to
write in moderate terms

about what I quite agree with
you in thinking a 'monstrous'
proposition.
