James Morrison of the Town of Montreal our true and
Lawfull Attorney for us and in our names to ask
Demand sue for and recover or receive all such Sums and
Sums of money now due and owing to us by virtue
of the Assignment unto us now made from any
person or persons whatsoever, And in Default of
payment thereof to have use and take all lawfull
ways and means in our names or in the names
of Holmes & Morrison or otherwise for the recovery
thereof by attachment Arrest or otherwise and on
Receipt thereof acquittances or other sufficient
Discharges for the same for us and in our names
to make sale and Deliver and to do all Lawfull
acts and things whatsoever concerning the premises
as fully in every respect as we ourselves could or
might do if we were personally present and an
Attorney or Attornies under him for the purposes
aforesaid to make and at pleasure to revoke hereby
Ratifying and confirming all and whatsoever our said
Attorney shall in our names Lawfully do or cause to be
in and about the premises, and further we the said
Thomas Wooder and John Blake by the power and
Authority to us given do appoint the said James
Morrison our attorney to make the Dividend of what
money he shall be able to collect from time to time and
pay the same to each respective Creditor mentioned
in the said Instrument in proportion to the Sums
annexed

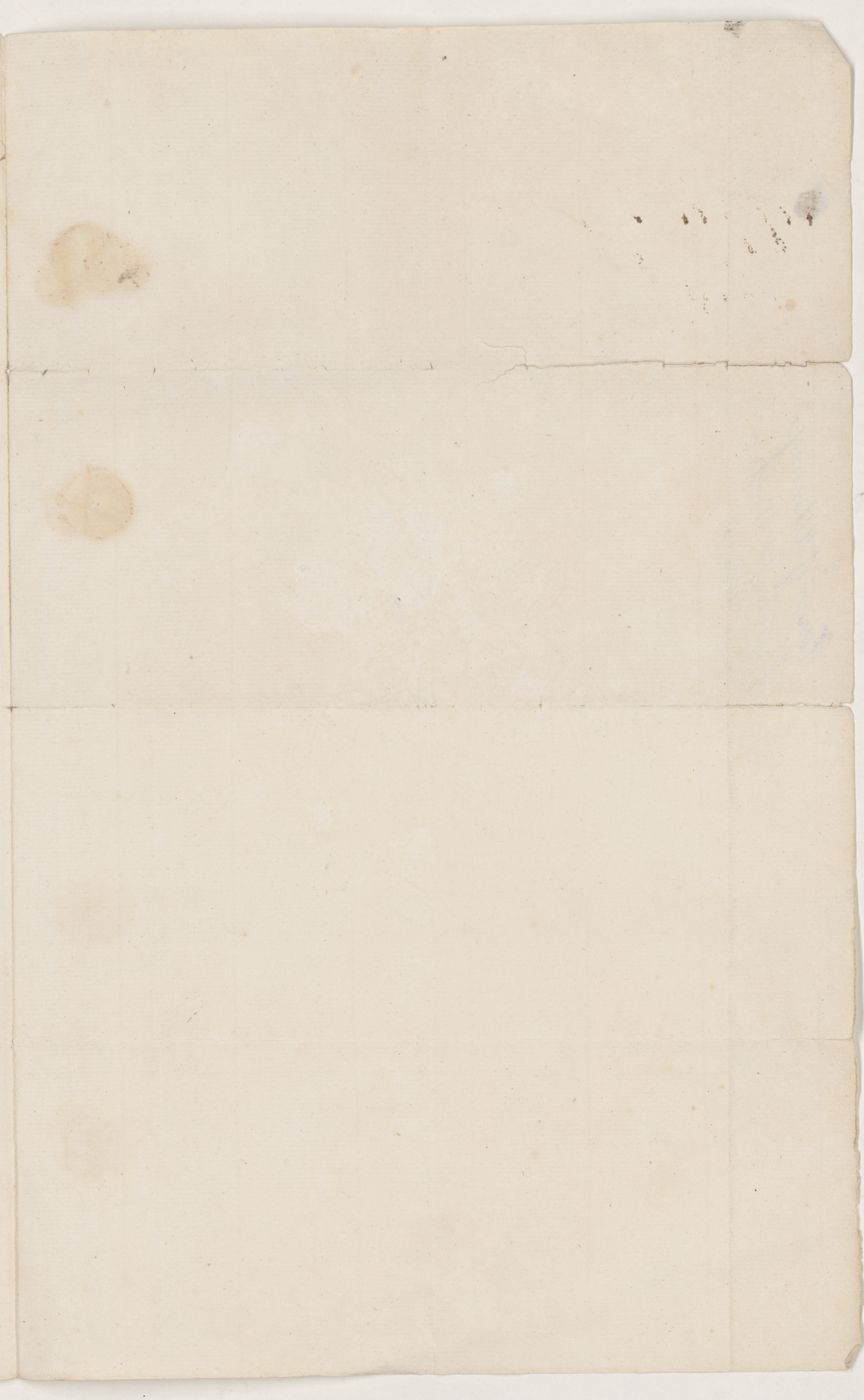

said James Morrison a negroe man servant Twenty
five years old named Lear which we do warrant free
of all faults and as our own Property from all persons
or persons whatsoever laying any claim to him the
said negroe, and further that if the said James
Morrison shall find any fault to the said negroe
from this date to the month of June next or
our or either of our returns to this place we will
oblige ourselves to take him the said negroe and
return the money again given under our
hand at Montreal this second day of March

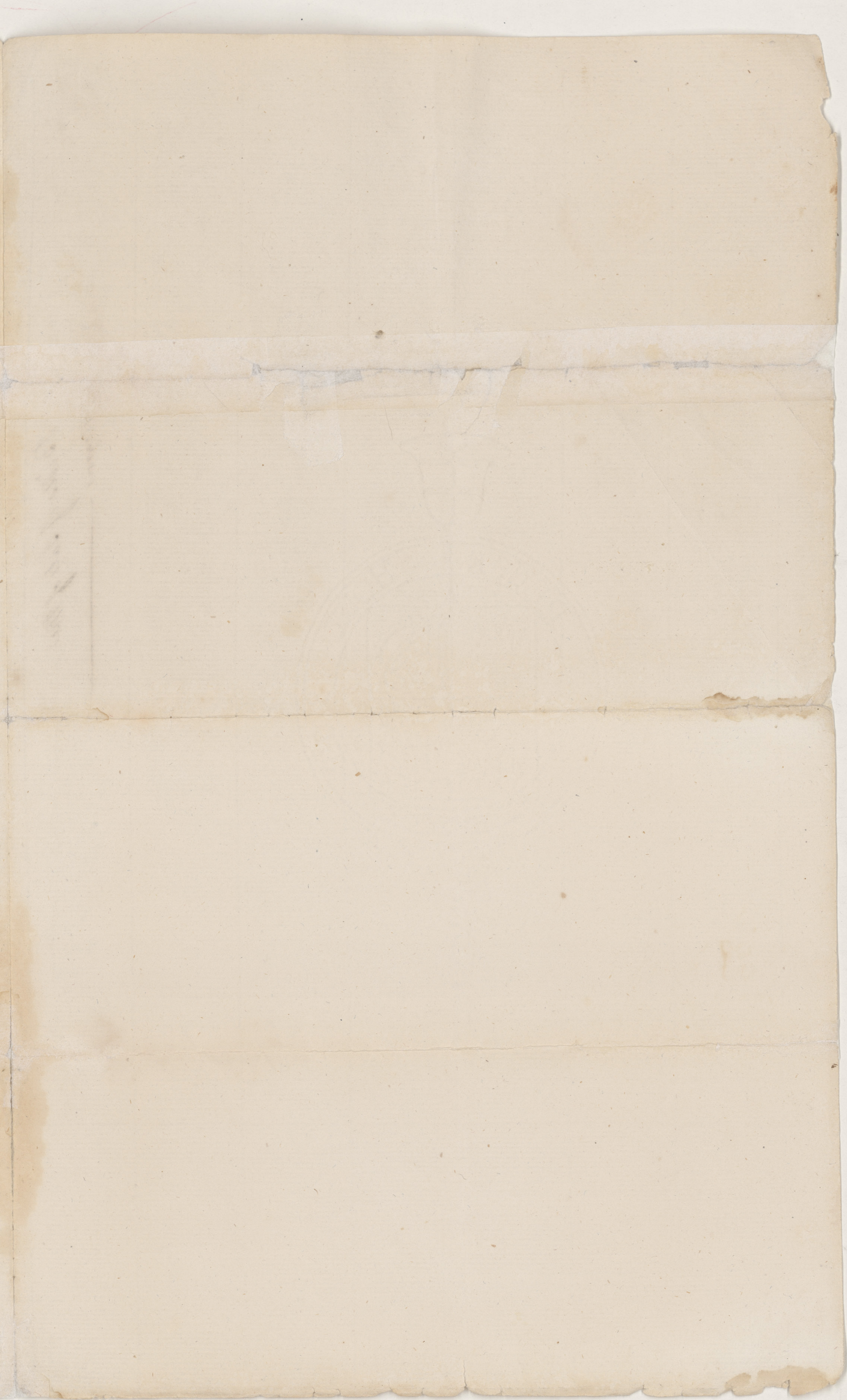



I the undersigned, Michael Neveu, master cabinetmaker residing in the *Récollets* suburb, promise & bind myself through the present document, to erect and establish for Mr. James Morrison on his land on the mountain, a cider-press with a wood-screw of the same model of that which is on the site, the walls and the spout all in oak wood of 17-18 square inches, the upper and lower tables; to provide the proper material; to build it and to install it ready for operating; perfectly ready and subject to inspection before the first of september next, for the amount of 190 *livres* or shillings ancient currency, under penalty of all damages and interest. Drawn up in two copies at Montreal, 24 November, 1795, for which I have received a payment on account of fifty *piastres*.
