I should have answered yours before but wished first to get all the information I could upon the subject, the result of my enquiries seems to induce me to wait a little longer, at least not to sell for less than three, and I shall loose enough at that, but I must dispose of as much as will raise £100. at the present price) that sum I must have and I hope you will be able to let me draw for it at 20 days sight which will answer, there can be no doubt of its taking a rise as none can be sold here under 3/6, Col Winslow arrived here yesterday express from Halifax, and brings an account of a Spanish war, the Spanish had taken two of our ships, and refused to release them, we had put 37 ships of the line into commission the command of the Brunswick was given to Prince William Henry, then was

one of the hottest preses ever known 2000 men being  
taken in one night on the Thames, a number of  
regiments were sent to the west Indias, and  
several more raising, it is said the fleet from  
Halifax with the Artillery Transports are in  
the river. But the report is not to be depended  
upon, Lord Dorchester's dispatches it is said are  
as late as the 6<sup>th</sup> May and contain his majesty's  
message to Both houses of parliament upon  
the above business, which I suppose we shall  
have in a day or two
