The Committee of the Magistrates appointed  
to carry into effect the Resolutions of all the Magistrates  
for establishing a Nightly Patrol report

That the Patrol commenced on Thursday the  
29<sup>th</sup> of October and has continued to be well attended  
till of late, but having understood that it is  
generally thought that there is not now great  
necessity to continue it after Wednesday the  
25<sup>th</sup> instans, and considering the expences which  
are daily incurred the Committee are of opinion  
that the Patrol be then discontinued.

That it appears to the Committee that the  
whole expences incurred amount to forty five  
pounds 3/4 of which they are of opinion that  
£ 27. 17. 11 should be defrayed by subscription  
as proposed in the 6<sup>th</sup> Resolution of the Magistrates  
and that the residue being £ 17. 5. 5 should  
be defrayed <sup>by</sup> moses of the Police.

All which is respectfully submitted.
