

Quebec 7th January 1796

My Dear Sir

I wrote you a few lines by —
Monday's Post, since which I have received
your favor of the 4th Instant. I did not
write to you Yesterday, by Post this Day
as Mr M Gill, leaves this to Morrow for
Montreal. I am sorry that you have not
yet closed the Bargain for Nipigan, perhaps
Mr Gill's arrival may be instrumental in —
bringing matters to a final Settlement. I had
some conversation with Richardson yesterday
& he appears to be very loath to take any
risk upon themselves whatever, that they can
do nothing Binding on Cameron & St Germain
& if they did, they would lay themselves open
to a prosecution the same as the Robestons
on the whole he don't appear Inclined
that Forsyth should make any Bargain
with us but ~~such~~ such as would keep
their House Harmless. I observe the intended
Proposal you mean to make to Blondeau

& that you had some intention of making him an offer of £300 for the whole Debt, due by Cameron & P. G. H. main.

I am very glad the Bonhomme is with you, tho' I believe his Business will call him here very soon, give our kind Compliments to him.

We had a very elegant Dance & Supper last Night at Mr. J. A. Coffin, which he gave in Compliments to Colonel & Mrs. Barnes. I wish you would send me a copy of the Balance Sheet, when Mr. M. Gill returns, or by any other private conveyance. "Are we in want of Callian or any other Indian Goods?"
