Gentlemen.

Preceding is Copy our last 1<sup>st</sup> Ult<sup>o</sup>, since when being without your favors, we have at present only to inform you, that our latest advices from Spain are favorable to the Article of Wheat, & that altho' the Crops in this Country have been unusually abundant - the Season of Harvest has been so wet, as to have occasioned an advance in the Price of Wheat which is now selling at 6/6d & is likely to rise; these Circumstances we hope may operate in favor of your Province; as we understand your Crops have also been great.

In the Market for Peltries, there is not any thing new, appearances are discouraging rather than otherwise, & we fear will remain so until the Politics on the Continent become more settled.

From a late advance in the Article of Wool of from 20 to 30% all kinds of Woolen Goods must go out much dearer than ensuing Spring - we are told Shrouds will be 10% dearer than last Spring; we presume Goods of every description will also go out much higher, as no branch of our Manufactures can keep pace with the demands on them - which we now mention that you may avail yourselves of making any purchases you can of Articles that may be on Sale thro' the Winter, & hoping we may soon receive agreeable advices from you We remain Respectfully
