Gentlemen,

Our last respects were under 1st Oct by the Packet, & Copy by a Ship via New York, since when being without your favours or any arrivals from your side, we have at present only to advise that appearances as to Wheat & Peltries remain the same, the former being likely to rise, & the latter to fall except the Import this Year be considerably less than the last, & which we really hope may be the case - as the Hudson's Bay Ships are come in & bring about 5000 Beaver & 2000 Otter less and of no Article more than last Year.

Appearances as to the Manufactures of this Country are also unfavorable, as almost every Article continues to rise, & we much fear will do so for some time, we therefore hope your Orders will be small for the ensuing Spring & particularly for Woolens, which will certainly be at least 20% dearer than last, & very difficult to be got even at that advance.
