Gentlemen

I have recd your sundry letters
dated 16th 18th 21st Sept & 16th 25th Octo & note their Contents.

£4500 of the Insurance stipulated for your acct has been transferred
to Mr Dohie, & remainder of the £5000 Covid for you was
applied to the covering of your Mr Grants Property as you
direct, The Bill for £34.10 on John Charlton being accepted
will in course be paid to the Credit of Mr Grants.

Respect of the God Lines complained of we intend speaking to Mr
Badgley & will hereafter advise you the result.

The sundry Bills inclosed amounting to £11402.10.3 Stg
having been accepted will in course be paid to your Credit, but they
become due; your motives for closing your acct with us, we have
no doubt, have reconciled the measure to your own Mind, and to
those also, of whose sentiments of gratitude we have hitherto had
proofs --- on the conduct you have thus shown, in return for
that liberality you have experienced from us, we shall only remark
