Referring to our other advice
by the Ships now going, this serves only to inform
you we have in conformity to our letter of ^{the} 17th of
last Interested you in One Eighth share of the
Ship Indian Trader, commencing with her present
Voyage, & that we have recd from Mr McTavish
£ 658 11, say Six Hundred & fifty Eight Pounds &
Eleven Pence Sterling for the same as on the 1st of July
last, & being the same Sum as paid by Mr Dobie
for his Share, not awaiting our advice of the increased
value of the Ship by consequence of the war
