George The Third by the grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland, King,
Defender of the faith and so forth... To the Keepers of our Peace, and to Our Justices assigned to hear
and determine divers felonies, trespasses and other Mis-demeanors done and committed within our District
of Montreal, and to every of them, Greeting. - We willing for reasons to be certified on a certain Proces-
Verbal of a Public Highway made by Louis Charleand Surveyor of Highways, Streets and bridges within the City
and Parish of Montreal in the said District, bearing date the eighth day of April last, intituled, "Proces verbal
"du Chemin de la division de St. Michel," which by the Consideration and Judgment of the Court of Quarter
Sessions of the Peace for the said District holden at the City of Montreal aforesaid on the fiftenth day of July
instant, was homologated and confirmed; Command you and every of you that the Proces verbal -
aforesaid and Judgment of Homologation thereon as fully and entirely with all things touching it, to the
Hon. the Chief Justice and others the Justices of our Court of King Bench in and for the said District
of Montreal on the first day of September next you or two of you under your Seals do certify, and send
together with this writ, that there may be further done what of right shall by our said Justices be thought
fit to be done. - Witness The Hon. James Monte, our Chief Justice of our said Court of King Bench
at Montreal aforesaid this thirtieth day of July in the fortieth year of our Reign. -
